New England Maple Cream Prepare your sweet buds because sugaring season is going strong in the north and northeastern areas of the United States. Stock up on real maple syrup and products at a local farm. Before you start cooking, tuck away a little extra syrup—whether you harvested it yourself or bought it from a sugarmaker—to help the Vermont Maple Sugar Makers Association send our troops the taste of a Vermont spring.

For the fifth year, the VMSMA is organizing "Operation Vermont Maple Sweetness 2009." The VMSMA encourages donations of one gallon of syrup, which will be packaged into one pint containers and shipped to the military bases in Iraq and Afghanistan. Over 8,000 pints of syrup were sent in 2008.

The VMSMA received several heartfelt e-mails from the troops in response to last year's donations: "Thank you for the effort that people in Vermont went through with Operation Vermont Maple Sweetness."
